This year's graduating class of ten adults from Atlantic City, Egg Harbor City, Hammonton, Pleasantville, and Somers Point received hands-on water utility industry and essential classroom-based business training at New Jersey American Water's Egg Harbor City Water Treatment Facility.

They also toured New

Jersey American Water's Delaware River Water Treatment Plant in Delran and the Atlantic County Utilities Authority <u>wastewater treatment plant and environmental park</u> to learn about wastewater treatment and renewable energy, respectively. The class also earned their OSHA 30 certification and six college technical elective credits from Rowan College of South Jersey through completion of the program.

First launched in the fall of 2021, the Water UP! program has included cohorts in Camden, Plainfield, and Lawnside, N.J. The 2024 Water UP! program is funded by a grant from the New Jersey Governor's Office of Climate Action and the Green Economy, and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection's Building our Resilient, Inclusive, and Diverse Green Economy (BRIDGE) Initiative.
