The Report Card highlights the urgent need for significant investment in water and wastewater infrastructure, not just across the nation, but also here in Maryland," said Runkle. "Our state continues to face challenges when it comes to investing in critical infrastructure – particularly in these sectors – but Maryland American Water is taking a proactive approach to investing in our systems. In fact, earlier this week, we announced that our 2024 investments in water and wastewater system upgrades totaled more than \$5.3 million."

With over a trillion dollars in infrastructure investments needed in water and wastewater across the country over the next two decades, American Water continues to work with local, state and federal leaders to provide expertise and investment in communities across Maryland that need to strengthen their water systems.
