

Boil Water Advisory Lifted for City of Camden Water Customers

Camden, N.J. – February 25, 2026 – City of Camden water customers residing in properties south of Ferry Ave through Collings Road, encompassing Fairview, Morgan Village and Centerville, as well as a small portion of Waterfront South, were notified on February 22, 2026 to boil the tap water before using as a precautionary measure, due to a water main break. **Repairs have been completed and subsequent water quality testing shows the water is safe.**

The Boil Water Advisory is LIFTED, and it is no longer necessary to boil your water before using. The following measures are strongly encouraged at this time:

- Run your cold-water faucets for 3-5 minutes to flush your service connection and interior plumbing with water from the service main.
- Empty and clean your automatic ice makers and water chillers.
- Drain and refill your hot water heater if the temperature is set below 113 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Service connections with a water softener/cartridge filter should be run through a regeneration cycle or other procedures recommended by the manufacturer.
- Water reservoirs in tall buildings should be drained and refilled (as applicable).
